For Safety reasons no motorcycles, mopeds, motor scooter, or golf carts will be allowed on the club grounds, except those used by shoot personnel. No boats or personal water craft will be allowed on the launch ramp or in the beach area at the Kingsburg Gun Club for the duration of the shoot.

The Kingsburg Gun Club and the CGSTA membership are animal lovers, but we respectfully request that you please leave your pets at home, if you must bring your pets and are participating in the shoot or camping on the grounds you will be resistricted to the east end of the grounds near E bank with your pets. Shotgun shells and other shooting supplies will be available on the grounds, and we ask that you please patronize our vendors during your visit. No other shells may be sold on the club grounds. Anyone caught selling or delivering shells on the club grounds will be asked to leave.



Minimum target requirements must be shot in California at CGSTA shoots.

Candidates must have competed at a minimum of five (5) different California clubs and shoot all three disciplines in at least two (2) different California zones to qualify. At least 100 Singles, 100 Handicap, and 100 Doubles must be shot in a second California zone. All Candidates must have shot all the Championship events (defined as the Championship Singles (200 targets), the Championship Handicap (100 targets) and the Championship Doubles (50 Pair) (400 targets total). The State Shoot can count as your fifth club but cannot count as your second zone if you live out of the central zone. All registered targets, regardless of where shot, will be used to calculate averages. Sub-Juniors are less than 15 years of age. Juniors are at least 15 years of age but less than 18 years of age. Veterans are at least 65 years of age, but less than 70 years of age. Sr. Veterans are at least 70 years of age.

#### ENTRY AND REGISTRATION

The Handicap/ Cashier windows will be open starting Monday June 24th at 12:00pm The Hours shall be: Monday 12:00pm-3:30pm, Tuesday, June 25th-Friday, June 28th: 8:00am - 4:00pm. Saturday, June 29, from end of Annual Meeting to 4:00pm and Sunday June 30, from end of Annual Meeting till 12:00 pm. Entry Fees shall be paid either by check or cash. No 3rd Party checks shall be allowed.

#### MISSED SQUAD OR RESQUADDING

Any shooter resquadding in any event or missing his/her squad and desiring to re-enter shall pay \$20.00 processing fee. No shooter will be allowed to make-up more than two (2) sub-events(50 targets)on the practice traps if he/she has missed his/her squad. A shooter unable to join his/her squad before they have completed the first station of their second sub-event must be resquadded and pay the \$20.00 late entry penalty

#### CLASSIFICATION

- Shooters are required to have both their Singles average and Doubles average computed for
  use by the Handicap Committee on the targets they have shot for the current target year.
- 2. Shooters not having registered 1000 Single targets in the current and previous two(2) target years combined will shoot Class A or higher at the discretion of the Handicap Committee.
- 3. Shooters not having shot 1000 registered Handicap targets in the current and previous two (2) target years combined, will shoot penalty yardage. Adult Men, Junior Gold Men and Junior Men will shoot no less than 24 yards. Women (including Lady I, Lady II and Junior Gold Ladies), Sub Juniors, Veterans, and Sr. Veterans will shoot no less than 23 yards. Shooters also belonging to another trapshooting association must shoot their longest yardage.
- Shooters not having registered 500 Doubles in the current year and the previous two

   (2) target years combined will shoot Class A or higher at the discretion of the Handicap Committee.
- 5. Shooters, who meet the target requirements above, will be classified on their official average <u>and/or known ability</u>. A shooters classification can be modified in subsequent events as described in paragraph 1 of Rules and Regulations. The classifications are as follows

A Lady I shooter is a woman who has not attained her 55th birthday. A Junior Gold shooter is a shooter who has attained his/her 18th birthday but not attained his/her 23rd birthday. A Junior shooter is a shooter who has not attained his/her 18th birthday. A Sub Junior shooter is a shooter that has not attained his/her 15th birthday. A Sub Veteran shooter is a shooter who has attained his/her 55th birthday but has not attained his/her 65th birthday. A Veteran shooter is a shooter 65 or more years of age and has not attained his/her 70th birthday. A Sr. Veteran shooter is a shooter 70 or more years of age

A Chair Shooter is a shooter that has registered as a chair shooer with the ATA prior to this event and is an approved chairshooter. A current list of approved chair shooters will be on hand in the classification office.

#### PURSE AND OPTIONS

There will be no refund of option fees once the event has begun and if a shooter has already entered the event no options can be added once the event starts. It is the responsibility of the shooter at time of cashiering to ensure that all event fees and option fees are correct on their receipt. All shooters should keep their entry sheet as this shows options played and squad assignments.

#### **RULES AND REGULATIONS**


- 1. Should a shooter win or tie for high in class in any singles event or in any doubles event or earn yardage in any handicap event, it shall be the shooters responsibility to report to the handicap room and have his/her classification and/ or yardage changed. Any shooter, whose class or yardage is changed for any reason, shall be considered to have been notified when the new class or yardage is posted on the bulletin board adjacent to the handicap room. Any shooter failing to carry out the above rule and who shoots in a class or from a yardage marked higher or lower than which is marked on the permanent file in the handicap room will be subject to penalty and will not be eligible to share in any money division or trophies, whatsoever.
- 2. Special Category shooters may declare only one category Lady I, Lady II, Junior Gold, Sub Junior, Junior, Sub Veteran, Veteran, Sr. Veteran, Chair Shooter.
- 3. It is the responsibility of category shooters to decide whether or not to declare, and they shall be totally and completely responsible for the implication of their decision, including purse and added money. If they declare, it is shooter responsibility to see that they are so designated on their entry form and on the bulletin sheets. Report omissions on the bulletin sheets to the Handicap Office.
- 4. Failure to file rule. Refer to the ATA Official Rules Book dated September 1, 2023. See pg. 28 VII, D, 1 through 5.
- 5. A contestant whose firearm breaks during the competition will have five (5) minutes to repair or replace the firearm and continue. If unable to do so, the remaining targets(up to a maximum of 50) may be completed at the makeup trap. Targets not completed in a sub event shall be scored LOST. (PG. 28 VII, C, 4)
- 6. Alcohol and Drugs. Refer to the ATA Official Rules book dated September 1, 2023. See page 41, XII,B,2 a and page 15, IV, I, 8.
- REGISTRATION FOR AN EVENT WILL CEASE AT THE START TIME PLUS 2 HOURS. Contestants will be permitted to enter the last half of a 200 target event until start time plus 2 hours of the second 100 targets

#### **PAYOFFS**

Payoff sheets for all options shall be final as posted at 10am the following day. All options will be posted on scoreboard after each event for review.

All Option checks will be mailed within two weeks of the last day of the state shoot. Checks will expire after 90 days of date written. No check will be re-issued after one year.

The office staff makes every effort to insure that your scores are correct. Please check the scoreboard to ensure your score is correct. Any score dispute shall be reported to the office by close of day. You are entitled to view the official scoresheet.



#### **ANNOUNCEMENTS**

This printed program will govern the California State Shoot

The current Amateur Trapshooting Association Official Rules will govern all points not otherwise enumerated. The Executive Committee reserves the absolute right, in its discretion, at any time prior to or during the California State Shoot to change or modify the program in any manner it desires. Interpretation of this program will be made by the Executive Committee and their decision shall be final.

In case entries are so numerous that darkness and or any other cause prevents the finish of any event the same day it commenced, the CGSTA reserves the authority to stop the shooting at any time it may be deemed necessary. In this case, conditions permitting, the event will resume where it was interrupted promptly the next day at a time no later than 8:00am.

In case of ties not otherwise covered, the monies for the number of places covered will be added together and divided equally among those in the tie, regardless of the outcome of any shoot-offs.

REFUND POLICY: Refunds will be issued on a case by case basis. Any changes, addtions(Options) or removal from an event must be completed 1 (one) hour prior to start of event.

State Shoot pins be will issued as long as supplies last

Starting Banks will be determined by a draw. Bank rotation sheets will be posted around the grounds and an announcement will be made prior to start of events as to the bank assignments. Please check your entry sheet for your squad number for the current event.

All ties in events 1,2,3,4,5 & 6 will be handled by carry over to next like event. The only exception will be in handicap if a score causes a change in yardage for one of the people involved in the tie. In the event of another "tie" after the carryover to the next like event the carry over will continue to the follow like event. All ties and carry overs will be "cleaned up" Friday June 28th.

#### **SHOOT-OFFS**

Contestants will be called: First Call, Second Call and Final Call for all shoot-offs. The Final Call will be made 10 minutes after the First Call. All shoot-off contestants must check in at the shoot-off table, The location of the shoot off table will be announced prior to shoot offs. Contestants not checking in at the shoot-off table within 5 minutes of the Final Call will forfeit their opportunity to compete for the trophy in question.

The Shoot-Off sheet will indicate the trophy(s) for decision. No other trophy decision will be part of the shoot-off unless it is indicated on the sheet prior to the beginning of the shoot-off.

CGSTA will make every attempt to have shoot-offs held before darkness or under the lights the same day the event was completed.

Violation of the ATA rule on Alcohol and drug use will disqualify the contestant from participate in the shoot-off. Refer to the ATA Official Rules book dated September 1 2023. See page 41, XII, B, 2;a and page 15, IV,I, 8.

#### **TROPHIES**

No shooter may win more than one (1) ATA trophy in the same event. This means a contestant may not win both Champion and runner-up/place, class, yardage, or special category.

Special category shooters may declare only one Category – Lady I, Lady II, Junior Gold, Sub Junior, Junior, Sub Veteran, Veteran or Sr. Veteran, ChairShooter.

Any shooter who is tied for event champion may shoot for the Championship trophy. If a shooter fails in the Champion Trophy shoot-off and has declared a special category, the shooter will fall back to category.

Any shooter who has declared a special category and whose score qualifies him/her for a trophy in that category will compete for the category trophy and not for place, class or yardage group.

Any shooter who has declared a special category and whose score doesn't qualify for a trophy in that category may compete for place, class or yardage group.

See Official ATA Rules dated September 1, 2023, Rule X, D; pg34-35.

#### **PURSES AND OPTIONS**

**High Gun System:** This is a winner(s) take all system where the shooters playing the purse with the highest score(s) divide the pot. If, for example, the purse money division is 40%-30%-20%-10% High Gun and there are two 100s and three 99s, the two 100s will receive 35% each (1/2 of the 40% +30%) and the three 99s will receive 10% each (1/3 of the 20%+10%).

**Lewis Class:** Other than the high score(s), the other winners in this purse are primarily a matter of chance (luck). When the event is completed, the scores of all participants are listed from highest to lowest and then they are divided into as many groups as there are classes. If a dividing line splits a score, that score goes to the group in which the majority reside, to the lower in case evenly split. At that point, each class allocates its (even) share of the total entry percentage system within the class.

**Percentage System:** This option is based on a fixed number of scores. For example, if the allocation is 50%-30%-20% Percentage system, then all participating shooters shooting the high score will split 50%, all participants shooting the second high score will split 30% and all participating shooters with the third high score will split the 20% share.

Federal Tax Law requires the issuance of 1099 Misc. on winnings over \$600. All shooters that play options at the 2023 state shoot will be required to supply their SS number in the event they are due a 1099 for winning over \$600.00.

#### TARGET SETTING

#### ALL ORANGE BLACKOUT WF TARGETS WILL BE THROWN

2. Section XIII – STANDARDS FOR TARGETS, TARGET SETTING "F. Rules for the use of radar guns and chronographs to set target speed High- power guns (Decatur, Stalker, most "police radar guns" and similar) may be used at the 16-yard line. The trap oscillation is stopped, and the target measured is a straightaway. The gun is pointed horizontally. The correct speed for a singles and handicap target is a minimum of 42 MPH, maximum 43 44 MPH. The correct speed for the right target of a doubles pair must be a minimum of 39 MPH, maximum of 40 41 MPH. A chronograph is to be used as close to the trap as practical and tipped up at approximately the same angle as the height of the target.

Field Supervisors (Line Referees) are the only individuals authorized to allow resetting of targets. *Targets shall only be reset if they become illegal or appreciably vary from the legal targets described above. The final decision as to whether a trap is to be reset shall be made by the Line Referees.*


All CGSTA members are encouraged to attend.

#### Conversations with Bill Hunter



William "Bill" Max Hunter California Hall Of Fame

#### My Call to Arms

Britain's policy of pacifying Adolf Hitler during the 1930s was failing spectacularly under the leadership of Prime Ministers Stanly Baldwin and Neville Chamberlain. Chamberlin simply would not recognize pure fanaticism when he saw it up close in his visits with Hitler in Berchtesgaden and Munich. British establishment coalesced around appeasement. Such institutions as the BBC, The Times, the City of London, the Church of England, the House of Lords and the Royal Family all put their weight behind pacification. To the extent of exhibiting rough and occasionally vicious moments when normally polite High Society bared its teeth at the anti-appeasers for daring to oppose the central policy of appeasement. It was this environment that allowed Hitler to build up his troupes, take the Sudetenland region of Czechoslovakia for Germany and occupy Norway, Holland, Belgium and the Netherlands. Fanaticism was familiar to Winston Churchill, who had seen it in its Islamic fundamentalist form while a soldier on the Northwest Frontier in India and in the Sudan. It was then that Chamberlain



resigned and in May of 1940 Winston Churchill was appointed British Prime Minister. He immediately began telephone conversations in secret with President Franklin D. Roosevelt to join Britain in stopping the German aggressions. In 1941, with the Japanese declaration of war on the United States and the British Empire and the December 7<sup>th</sup> Japanese attack on the U.S naval base at Pearl Harbor, President Roosevelt delivered the Day of Infamy speech and the United States entered the war.

Bill Hunter, then twenty years old, had a fascination with airplanes and was a focused and always dependable worker at his clerical position in the Materials Division of Douglas Aircraft in Los Angeles at the Pellissier Building on Wilshire Blvd and Western Ave. Upon hearing Roosevelt's Day of Infamy speech, he felt the welling up of inspiration and duty. "When I heard the president say 'now war has come and we must meet it as united Americans, I stood up from my desk and was at the air force recruiting office within the hour. I was ready to go. I had to go". Without a second thought, he marched straight to the United States Air Force Recruiting Depot on Wilshire Boulevard in downtown Los Angeles. Next stop for Bill Hunter was the Great Ashfield Airdrome, the Royal Air Force station in Suffolk, England. There Bill began as Supply Sergeant of the 549<sup>th</sup> Bomber Squadron and the adventure of his young life.

#### My home away from home





#### Great Ashfield Airdrome, Suffolk England

It was June 7<sup>th</sup> 1943, a beautiful day in the English countryside at the Great Ashfield Airdrome in Suffolk England, located approximately 100 miles north of London. The sun rays broke through a typical cloudy sky when a young Supply Sergeant of the 549th Bomber Squadron, William "Bill" Max Hunter, was diligently working away at his desk in the supply headquarters. Ordering equipment and making sure his supplies were ready for his men was his sole focus and occupied his keen attention. His squadron depended on him to outfit them with equipment and clothing. Their success was riding on his shoulders and no one was going to be let down. It was his crew, and he was going to make sure the Flying Fortresses, the B-17s, and their crew were supplied and ready for their missions.

"Our people, our territory, and our interests are in grave danger, with confidence in our armed forces, with the unbounding determination of our people, we will gain the inevitable triumph – so help us God."

~ Franklin D. Roosevelt December 8, 1941

Bill called the B-17 aircrew "the heart of the 385th". It was a badly kept secret that a B-17 crew man had a 50% chance of surviving a tour. For a B-17 and its crew, a combat tour was 25 missions and for those fortunate to still be upright, they would be initiated into "The Lucky Bastards Club."

Supply Sergeant Hunter was very aware of the challenges his crewmen faced and was exacting in the course of outfitting his crew. Each day Bill was privy to the mission reports which had the Captains name, Aircraft name followed by the stats. An important part of his assignment was the assessment and preparation for the next day's crew requirements.

Mission No. 27 – 10 October 1943 – Target Munster 21 a/c Flown
Pettinger, 42-6155, crashed in Germany, 10 POW, MACR 827
Whitlow, 42-3539, Michigan Air Force, crashed in Holland, 3 KIA, 4 POW, 3
evaded capture, MACR 826






Moll, 42-3388, Sleepytime Gal, returned, MACR 828
First replacement crew to finish 25 Missions and second crew to complete 25
missions in the entire 385<sup>th</sup>

Sleepytime Gal radioed the tower they were coming in, as other crippled B-17s were in formation to land they were told to circle. 'I'm coming in over and out' radioed Captain Moll. At that moment the last engine sputtered and coughed its last breath. With the airmen's knuckles turning white and holding altitude to the last moment Sleepytime Gal made a dead stick landing skidding on its belly off the end of the runway to make room for the other crews.

Bill's air crews wore clothes suitable for high altitude, normally 20,000 to 29,000 feet, where it was -40 to -50° F. The B-17 had no heaters and was not pressurized. Bill first made sure the crew had long underwear and flight overalls or a uniform depending on the crew task and rank. Then Bill prepared "Bunny Suits" for the crew, which were electrically heated coveralls. On top of the "Bunny Suits" came the fleece-lined jackets, pants, boot liners, boots, leather helmets and gloves. Next Bill supplied every crew member with their "Mae West", an inflatable life jacket. Bill outfitted each crew member with a parachute harness. The parachute was separate and could be hooked to the front of the harness if needed. Some chutes had hooks and some chutes had rings. The harnesses also had either hooks or rings. Woe to he who didn't pay attention to Bill, grabbed the wrong chute, and ended up with ring to ring!





Lucky Bastard Club Certificate

The Pilot sat in the left front seat of the airplane cockpit with the Co-pilot to his right. The Navigator, who always kept track of the aircraft position and logged the flight, was positioned in front of the cockpit, and manned the cheek guns when under attack. All the guns on the B-17 were 50 caliber machine guns. Below the nose of the plane in the chin turret was the Togglier curled up like a pill bug. In the very front of the nose cone was the Bombardier operating the Norden Bombsight that measured the aircrafts ground speed and direction and acting as a backup navigator when needed. The Flight Engineer, also the Top Turret Gunner was directly behind the pilots assisting them by calling out airspeeds when not firing away with his gun. The Waist Gunner was stationed mid-way between the wings and the tail of the fuselage and was assisted when under fire by the Radio Operator, who had a room to himself behind the bomb bay.



Below the airplane fuselage and just behind the radio room was the Ball Turret Gunner, described by Bill as the bravest of the brave. This crewman sat cramped in his position throughout the mission without room enough to wear a parachute. In the very back of the aircraft, referred to by Bill as "Clark's Heel", was the Tail Gunner.

Bill recalled the origins of the story going around the Airdrome that gave the Tail Gunner the "Clark's Heel" nick name. Clark Gable, the famous movie actor, enlisted as a bomber gunner flew in the "Delta Rebel". On a very dangerous raid on the Ruhr valley in Germany he dodged death while wedging himself behind the Tail Gunner for a better view. A 20mm shell penetrated the bomber from below, flying past Gable, cutting off the heel of his boot, and exiting the plane just inches from his head without exploding.

One day, focused on his duties at hand, Bill heard a low pitched buzzing sound off in the distance like that of a motorcycle engine. It grew louder and louder and very quickly Bill became alarmed. It sounded like it was close to the ground and



quickly heading his way. Was it one of Hitler's doodlebugs, a half ton bomb with wings strapped to an engine used by the Germans to terrorize British civilians? As if they needed anymore terrorizing, Bill thought. Doodlebugs were notorious for not having any navigational devices, completely missing their targets and flying indiscriminately across the countryside. Bill had heard them before off in the distance but then they disappeared. "Could it really be?" As the sound grew exponentially louder, Bill's brain said "get yourself moving" while his body felt strangely heavy. The sounds and vibrations all around him seemed to go into a surreal slow-motion as the building walls slanted and the world went dark.

A huge explosion ripped the roof right off the supply quarters, blew glass everywhere and made confetti of the clothing and equipment that had filled the brick and glass structure. Shaking and hesitant to take a breath, Bill moved his left arm to see if it was still attached. Then gingerly reaching down he touched his left leg. "Was it still there?" he asked himself. Breathing a sigh of relief his hand felt his left leg and it was intact. At least he still had two limbs. Now he tried for a couple more. His right arm was cooperating and he was able to find his other leg still attached even though it was pinned under a crumpled metal shelf thrown by the explosion.

Flat on his back and looking up from the floor of the destroyed supply quarters with no desk where it had just been a moment before, Bill opened his eyes to see a cloudy sky through the haze of smoke and ash. He would live another day.

Bill would often say, "The aircrews and their aircraft were the tip of the spear. The rest of the 385<sup>th</sup> personnel served to launch the spear toward the heart of the enemy, day after day after day".





385th Bomb Group 549th Bomber Squadron

In total, the 385<sup>th</sup> Bomb Group with the tireless dedication of Supply Sergeant Hunter, flew 296 missions from the Great Ashfield Airdrome. In the greater mission of defeating Germany in World War II, 129 B-17s were lost. The 549<sup>th</sup> Bomber Squadron and the 385<sup>th</sup> Bomber Group returned home on August 28, 1945 including Supply Sergeant William "Bill" Max Hunter with all limbs attached and spirit intact.

#### Family, Work and Trap Shooting

Bill landed Stateside on the production line in 1945 at Hunter Woodworks, a wood pallet maker in Carson, California, under the ownership and tutelage of his Uncle George. From raw timber to finished product, Bill learned his way around the woodworks. Always tenacious and dedicated in his assignment, Bill worked to fulfill his Uncle's wishes with the same exacting focus and determination that kept the men of the 549<sup>th</sup> Bomber Squadron supplied. Bill swung the hammer, milled the wood and swept the floors until he eventually managed the operation and built

it into a company with twelve-foot band saws, nailing machines, sawdust hoppers and trucks filled daily with products for their customers around the country.

Uncle George was an avid hunter and thought "what better way to hone one's shotgun skills than at the trap range", which is just what he loved to do. It was Uncle George who introduced Bill to trap shooting. In 1966, Bill registered his first American Trapshooting Association (ATA) targets and he was hooked. From then on it was every Saturday after his early morning duties at the office that Bill was off to the International Trap Club Los Angeles, Laguna Hills Trap Club or Ventura Club for an ATA event that usually included Sunday. The business grew and it was with Bill's grandson Jeremy and his trusted manager Bruce's help that the business was running smoothly and Bill could pursue his Trap Shooting interests. In 1996, Bill purchased a motorhome and made trap shooting a full-time vocation. Traveling as far east as the Great Lakes, and shooting in Washington, Oregon, Utah, Nebraska, Ohio, Texas, Nevada and Arizona were just a few his stops. Bill was on the road for up to six weeks at a time. He always loaded up the motorhome with shells and everywhere he went he gave away more shells than he shot. With more than 250,000 targets registered, that was a lot of shells! Bill's generosity to trap shooting included but was not limited to:


- Producing the shoot calendar for California 1969 1976
- Donating more than 1,000 ATA Life Memberships
- Giving a one-year Trap & Field subscription to anyone posting their first 100 or 200 in any Satellite Grand, Golden West Grand or the Grand American event
- Gifting 1,000's of awards to clubs around the country such as Silver Dollar Money clips, Silver Dollar Ladies necklaces and \$50 Gold Coin Belt Buckles
- Contributing Silver Seitz shotguns as fund raisers for the Hall of Fame
- Establishing the George Hunter Memorial trophy through the Hall of Fame for the high senior veteran in the Grand American Handicap

Bill's dedication and generosity was manifest to his core. His allegiance to defending our country and to his men of the 549<sup>th</sup> Bomber Squadron was unwavering. His devotion to his wife, Ruthie, his two daughters, Jan and Kim, was resolute and his support and appreciation for his trap shooting family was a gift by grace. We say thank you, Bill, and strive to be our best in honor of an incredible man.


